PATIENT BLOOD MANAGEMENT (PBM) is the timely application of evidence-based medical and surgical concepts designed to maintain hemoglobin concentration, optimize hemostasis and minimize blood loss in an effort to improve patient outcome. The SABM PBM Standards include:
